OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Subject:- Second OEM in the Gulf of Kutch - M/s Indian Oil Corporation - environmental clearance req.

....
The undersigned is directed to refer to the above and to state that environmental aspects of the project have been examined and the project is accorded environmental clearance subject to the following conditions :

- i. The project authority must strictly adhere to the stipulations made by the State Pollution Control Board and the State Govt.
- ii. The project authorities should clearly delineate the sea route and should stick to the sea route as approved by the Pollution Control Board/Maritime Authorities.
- iii. Any expansion of the system can be taken up only with the prior approval of this Ministry.
- iv. Adequate number of water quality monitoring stations must be set up in consultation with the State Pollution Control Board and the water quality monitored, and the results should be statistically analysed and the report sent to this Ministry once in six months and to the State Pollution Control Board once in three months.
- v. A detailed risk analysis based on maximum credible accident analysis should be done for the storage. Based on this a disaster management plan has to be prepared and after approval by the concerned nodal agency, should be submitted to this Ministry within six months.

- vi. A separate environmental management cell with suitably qualified people to carry out various functions should be set up under the control of senior executive, who will report directly to the head of the organisation.
- vii. The funds earmarked for the environmental protection measures should not be diverted for other purposes and year-wise expenditure should be reported to this Ministry.

2. The Ministry or any other competent authority may stipulate any further condition after reviewing the comprehensive impact assessment report or any other reports prepared by project authorities.

3. The Ministry may revoke clearance, if implementation of the conditions is not satisfactory.

4. The above conditions will be enforced, inter-alia, along with the Water (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, Air (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1981, and Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, and Public Liability Act, 1991 along with their amendments.
