IndianOil takes immense pride in the fact that it has a galaxy of sports stars that it proudly calls IOCians. IndianOil, over the last three decades, has been actively involved in the promoting sports across the nation. This is being done not only through recruitment of sportspersons, but by offering sports scholarships to budding talented sportspersons, providing equipment and kits to rural school children and sponsoring major sporting events not only within the country but internationally as well.

IndianOil has also been providing its best Ex International sportspersons to National Federations and State Sports bodies in view of contributing best coaches to nurture talent and develop future Champions of India in various sports.

IndianOil also rewards exemplary performance of its Sportstars by bestowing them with cash awards for their outstanding international performances and acknowledgements in the form of National awards. Out of turn promotions for outstanding international performances by sportspersons is also offered to them to encourage them to put in their best in the sport and ensure India shines at the International arena.

Acknowledging the fact that sports can play a key role in the socio-economic growth of the nation, IndianOil recruited the first batch of sports persons in the year 1982 encompassing sports like badminton, cricket, table tennis and tennis. The next batch came in 1992 which was followed by bringing in carrom players in 1995, chess players in 1996 and hockey players in the year 2000. IndianOil's sports policy was formulated and implemented in the year 2003 which included recruitment, performance evaluation, promotion, re-designation, facilities for sportspersons, kit items policy, code of conduct. From humble beginnings, IndianOil now has a

sanction of having 115 sports players on its payroll.

While the pandemic dominated the sports world during the last two years, IndianOil took these years to consolidate its sports culture. From transforming its sports policy to bringing in new enthusiastic players and guiding them towards earning national glory, supporting ex-national and international sportspersons to set-up sports academies and encourage them to coach the future sportstars and even unique initiatives, IndianOil left no stone unturned in giving a major boost to sports in India.

IndianOil, over the last three decades, has been actively involved in the promoting sports across the nation. This is being done not only through recruitment of sportspersons, but by offering sports scholarships to budding talented sportspersons, providing equipment and kits to rural school children and sponsoring major sporting events not only within the country but internationally as well. IndianOil has been extending support to numerous international, national as well as State sports tournaments. Important Cricket series, T-20, Kabaddi, Badminton TT leagues, World Boxing championships, National badminton, TT, Carrom, Chess championships, Hockey National, state championships, Prestigious marathons, etc.

While IndianOil is known as the leader in Oil and Gas industry of India but when it comes to encouraging sports, IndianOil has left indelible imprints across different sports which have been nationally acknowledged as the Corporation was recently bestowed the "Rashtriya Khel Protsahan Puskar" for the year 2021. The award was presented by Hon'ble President of India Mr Ram Nath Kovind at Rashtrapati Bhavan on 13th November 2021. Chairman, Mr Shrikant Madhav Vaidya, received the award on behalf of IndianOil.

INDIANOIL SPORTS HIGHLIGHTS

1. At present IndianOil has 106 recruited sportspersons in 10 sports. (Cricket, Badminton, Table tennis, Tennis, etc.)
2. First Corporate Women's Hockey team - 15 girls were inducted into IndianOil in March 2022 in officer cadre.
3. IndianOil is collaborating with Sports Ministry for a unique program to provide support to girls from game Athletics. IndianOil has titled this project as "IndianOil Shakti" and is endeavoured towards scouting for talented girls between age of 13 to 18 yrs and providing support towards their training /coaching/etc. The project amount is approx 7 crores.
4. IndianOil has a very robust/successful sports scholarship scheme - named as "IndianOil Acers" where in monthly stipend, tournament expenses and kit allowance is provided to 250 budding sportspersons in 20 games to give encouragement for taking up the sports at higher level.
5. Parivartan- Prison to pride program, wherein IndianOil sportspersons impart sports training to prison inmates with aim at rehabilitating them and aid for smooth re-entry into society. This program has already been successfully implemented 30 jails in 23 states across India - Using Sports as tool to bring about a positive change in lives of inmates.

Parivartan - Prison to Pride

Today Prison is treated more as a correctional or improvement facility which itself indicates that there is more emphasis on reformation of prisoners in the form of punishment. To achieve this goal, a pleasant atmosphere is required to be created in jails for the benefit of inmates. Apart from emphasis on social and ethical values for integration with society after release, inmates also require educational, recreational, and vocational training facilities. This will help to provide them with alternate sources of livelihood after release. In coordination with the Prisons Department of the respective State police, the IndianOil provides coaches to train the inmates in badminton, chess, table tennis, volleyball, tennis, carrom, kabaddi,

kho kho and basketball.

In line with IndianOil's Corporate Core Value of '**Care**', the Corporation launched a novel initiative '**Prison to Pride**' adding joy and health to the lives of Prison Inmates through sports coaching. The programme aims to help inmates overcome the stigma associated with imprisonment and aid in their smooth integration into the society upon their release. With **International Sports Players** training the prison mates, the Corporation reached out to over **2000 inmates across 13 states and 25 cities** through this programme. The third phase of this initiative will be launched this month by **Chairman, IndianOil, Mr. Shrikant Madhav Vaidya**.



IndianOil launched Parivartan - an initiative to train inmates in select sports - at select prisons across the country. The initiative was inaugurated by Mr. Shrikant Madhav Vaidya, Chairman, IndianOil on August 15, 2021.

Under this initiative, IndianOil, in coordination with Prisons Department of the respective State Police, is facilitating training programmes in badminton, volleyball, chess, tennis, and carrom across prisons in India to help improve the physical and mental

well-being of prison inmates. This unique initiative coincides with India's 75th Independence Day being celebrated as Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav.

During the four-week-long training, 129 inmates were coached in the basics of the sport, enabling them to participate in local competitions, besides recreation. Under this programme, IndianOil is providing the equipment and kits to the participants. This initiative will also boost the participants' self-esteem and confidence.

IndianOil’s Prison to Pride initiative was much appreciated and encouraged across the states where it was launched. Motivated by the positive impact, IndianOil launched second phase of Parivartan initiative; to 17 prisons in ten states across India in which over 1000 inmates are undergoing sports coaching.

The initiative was inaugurated in a physical event held at Tihar Jail in New Delhi and virtually at eight locations by Mr. Shrikant Madhav Vaidya, Chairman, IndianOil, to coincide with Gandhi Jayanti celebrations. Simultaneously, the coaching camp went underway at another eight locations.





In the second phase, IndianOil, in coordination with the Prisons Department of the respective State Police, will facilitate **coaching programs in multiple sporting disciplines including basketball, badminton, volleyball, chess, tennis, table tennis, kho-kho, and carrom across prisons in India** to help improve the physical and mental well-being of prison inmates, especially during this pandemic period.



In its first phase, Parivartan was launched in Chanchalguda Central Jail (Hyderabad), Puzhal Central Jail (Chennai), Poojapura Central Jail (Trivandrum), Special Jail (Bhubaneswar), and Circle Jail (Cuttack). The participating prisons in the second phase of Parivartan are Central Jail, Tihar, Delhi; Yerawada Central Jail, Pune; Kolhapur Central Prison; Central Jail, Patiala; Lala Lajapat Rai District and Open Air Jail, Dharamshala; Central Jail, Indore; Central Jail, Bhopal; Central Jail, Ahmedabad; Central Jail, Vadodara; Adarsh Karagar, Lucknow; Central Jail, Varanasi; Naini Central Jail, Prayagraj; Central Jail, Guwahati; Central Jail, Dibrugarh, Central Jail, Dimapur.

IndianOil also employs prison inmates and people who have finished their prison term as customer attendants at 30 retail outlets in Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, and Rajasthan.

Chess for Freedom

The rights and opportunities of self-realization and development for people in imprisonment are essential prerequisites in order to consciously build their future after liberation. Access to training and learning, as well as to quality ways of socializing could give strong motivation to change for better.

Chess is a game that not only allows the inmates to spend a quality time and socialize in a smart and safe way, but also can serve for decreasing such common symptoms like depression, stress, and anxiety. Developing memory and logical thinking, improving concentration skills and imagination may foster their reintegration after liberation. Chess inspires self-motivation, develops the capacity to for-see consequences and demonstrates the success is a reward of hard work.

To support and promote this line of work, the International Chess Federation (FIDE) and the Cook County Sheriff's Office (Chicago, USA) have signed a cooperation agreement and launched the "Chess for Freedom" program. This project kicked off in May 2021 with an online conference and an exhibition tournament with four participant countries. Later on, in October, the first Intercontinental Online Chess Championship for Prisoners - a much larger competition with the participation of tens of prisons will be held.

The recent years have witnessed the successful introduction of chess in prisons through different educative programs in the USA, Armenia, Norway, Russia, England, Brazil, Italy and Spain, with very positive outcomes.

1st Intercontinental Online Championship for Prisoners

Forty-two teams representing 31 countries played in the group stage of the inaugural event held in the autumn of 2021. Prisoners from Italy, England, Armenia, Spain, Palestine, Germany, Russia, United Arab Emirates, Colombia, Portugal, Philippines, Australia, Norway, Czech Republic, Ecuador, Mongolia, Uruguay, Ukraine, Serbia, Trinidad and Tobago, Jamaica, Georgia, Zimbabwe, Turks & Caicos Islands, Croatia, Kyrgyzstan, Argentina, Cyprus, The Netherlands, USA and Macedonia were divided into six groups. Two top teams from each group proceeded to the Championship round.

Mongolia became the winner of the 1st Intercontinental Online Championship for Prisoners, while Georgia dominated the women's tournament.

Online Chess Tournament under Parivartan

IndianOil, in Association with All India Chess Federation organised 1st ever "Parivartan - Prison to pride Online Chess Tournament" on 30th September and 1st October 2022. Total 20 Prisons participated in this first ever unique Tournament in India. This selection Trial Tournament was arranged to select 2 teams in men Category, 1 Women Category and 1 Junior Category to represent Indian Prisons in the Intercontinental "Chess for Freedom Tournament" organized by World Chess Federation on 13-14 October 2022.

The Tournament was inaugurated by Shri U.P. Singh ED I/C (HR), Head Office, in presence of Managing Director of World Chess Federation Ms. Dana Ozola, and Deputy President Asian Chess Federation Shri Bharat Singh Chauhan. Also present on this occasion were Senior Officials

of Indian Oil, Authorities from different Prisons, Chess Coaches, Chess Arbiters, Indian Oil Chess Grandmasters, Sports Coordinators, and Prison Inmates taking part in the Tournament.

Women Grandmaster Padmini Rout, shared her experience of coaching the Prison Inmates. She expressed her unique experience and how this program has changed the attitude of inmates positively.

Shri Bharat Singh Complemented and thanked Indian Oil for Parivartan initiative and offered complete support from AICF and Asian Chess Federation. he requested IOCL to consider running special programs for girl child in the field of Chess.

Ms. Dana Ozola, who had joined all the way from Latvia, congratulated IOCL and Chairman Shri Shrikant Madhav Vaidya for their sustained effort in the field of social empowerment to prisoners through various games, including Chess. She requested AICF and IOCL to join hands with FIDE in this noble initiative in future also.

At the end of 6 Swiss league rounds, top 4 prisons qualify for the semi final. All the prisons performed well and they showed their chess skills / knowledge. During the event we saw many interesting & intense battles between players. Players enjoyed the 10 min + 5 sec rapid online format. The prisons which qualify for semis are, Bhubaneshwar, Prayagraj, Kolhapur and Pune.

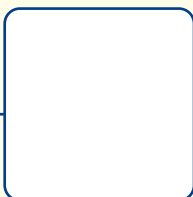

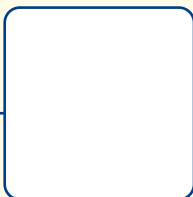
