Crude was taken into tank T-307 of Panipat Refinery for the first time on November 30, 1997. A grand, Silver Jubilee celebration, to mark this occasion, was held on November 30, 2022, at the Refinery that saw participation by the Chairman and senior officials of the Corporation

Panipat Refinery – ‘Edifice of Excellence’

Panipat Refinery was built in 1998 with an initial installed capacity of 6.0 MMTPA, using world-class technology from IFP France; Haldor-Topsoe, Denmark; and UNOCAL/UOP, USA and Stone & Webster, USA. Its capacity was expanded to 12 MMTPA in August, 2006 and subsequently to 15 MMTPA in 2010, with the aim to cater to growing demand.

Panipat Refinery & Petrochemical Complex (PRPC) is one of the largest petrochemical hubs of IndianOil. Spread over 4,222 acres, PRPC caters to the demand of petroleum products of Haryana as well as the entire Northwestern region, including Punjab, J&K, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, parts of Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, and Delhi.

Gearing up for auto fuel policy

To meet environmental standards complying to Euro III/IV norms for MS, the MSQ project consisting of PENEX (Isomerization) – 400 TMTPA, Naphtha Hydrotreater Unit – 410 TMTPA, Reformate Splitter – 470 TMTPA, and FCC Gasoline Desulphurisation – 370 TMTPA was completed and commissioned in November, 2009. Panipat became the first refinery of IndianOil to switch over from BS-II/BS-III fuels to more ecofriendly BS-IV compliant fuels.

Panipat Refinery Additional Expansion Project (PRAEP) from 12 to 15 MMTPA

Panipat Refinery Additional Expansion Project (PRAEP) was a low cost capacity augmentation through maximum utilization/revamp of existing units/facilities; for increasing the refining capacity from 12 MMTPA to 15 MMTPA (3,30,000 BPD). The expansion was based on processing of 3 MMTPA High Sulphur Crude. The project was completed and commissioned in November, 2010 and is fully operational.

Propelling into petrochemicals – for a brighter tomorrow

Seeking an alternative to export of surplus naphtha, IndianOil entered into petrochemicals as a value addition means. Accordingly, a world class Petrochemicals Plant comprising of PX/PTA Complex and Naphtha Cracker Complex was setup in 2006 and 2010 respectively. The Plants are designed to synergise with the existing Panipat Refinery generating a bouquet of value-added products.

crore was commissioned in March 2010. IndianOil completed the construction and commissioning of the project in a record time of 46 months.

The polymer products from the Naphtha Cracker are LLDPE (linear low-density ethylene), HDPE (high density polyethylene), and Polypropylene. The downstream Industry feed stocks are MEG, DEG (mono/di ethylene glycol) and benzene. Applications of LLDPE include multilayer film for packaging, milk packing, water storage tanks, road barriers, etc. HDPE is used for making bins, crates, pipes and pipe coating, woven sack bags, mosquito nets, containers, shopping bags, etc. Benzene is used for production of detergents, pesticides, solvents, paints and varnishes, adhesives in rubber processing, etc.

Towards sustained growth

PRPC has emerged as a vast canvas for IndianOil's petrochemicals dream plan. Stream sharing, exchange of process streams and utilities, and synergy in operations of Panipat Refinery with Naphtha Cracker has positioned the Complex as the third largest petrochemical hub in Southeast Asia.

ISRL – pioneering e-SBR footprints in India

Indian Synthetic Rubber Limited — a glowing example of international collaboration — has been a path-breaking joint venture of IndianOil; TSRC Corporation, Taiwan; and Marubeni Corporation — Japan. It is a giant step towards forward integration that heralded nation's first e-SBR plant.

The flagship project, spread over 57 acres, has provided

a major boost to the domestic rubber industry. It has also provided an opportunity to optimise the logistics and inventory carrying costs of domestic consumers.

ISRL's e-SBR project is a step towards realisation of elastomer complex based on various feed stocks available at its Panipat Naphtha Cracker Complex. The project provides value-addition to the butadiene stream of Panipat Naphtha Cracker Plant.

Make in India initiatives

The petrochemicals

PTA is a raw material for production of Polyester Staple Fiber (PSF), Polyester Filament Yarn (PFY), and other resins. PTA unit at Panipat has helped in seamless integration with the already available common facilities. The Plant has a design capacity of 360 TMT of Paraxylene — an

intermediate product used in the manufacture of PTA — per annum and 553 TMT of PTA per annum utilising naphtha from Mathura and Panipat refineries.

World-Class Naphtha Cracker

IndianOil's first and largest Naphtha Cracker Unit went on-stream on March 11, 2010. Besides generating ethylene and propylene, the Unit also generates LPG, pyrolysis gasoline, and benzene.

The balance downstream polymer units were commissioned progressively between April to May, 2010. NCU was erected and commissioned in 46 months which compares with global standard for erection and commissioning of similar capacity plants.

Butene-1 Plant

Butene-1 is a raw material used as a co-monomer in LLDPE and HDPE plants for production of polymer products. The in-house production of the essential raw material has eliminated dependency on imported Butene-1. The project is a demonstration of IndianOil's thrust for Make in India.

Styrene Recovery project

IndianOil is setting up a Styrene Monomer Plant having a capacity 387 KTPA at PRPC by recovering ethylene feedstock from Indmax Off gas. Other feedstock benzene will be available from Benzene Extraction Unit of Panipat Naphtha Cracker Complex.

Products dispatch

The petroleum products from PRPC are transported through various modes like rail, road, and environment-

friendly pipelines. The LPG produced at the Refinery is pumped through a dedicated pipeline to IndianOil's Kohand Bottling Plant. Bottling and bulk dispatch is carried out at Kohand Bottling Plant. Part LPG is further pumped from Kohand to Nabha and Jalandhar through a cross-country pipeline, that was commissioned in April 2009.

The 740 m long and 80 m wide polymer warehouse at Panipat has 15 online bagging and palletising machines. Each bagging machine has a capacity to bag 1,200 bags per hour. 50 loading bays are utilised to load the bags in trucks. Fork-lifts are utilised in the movement of bags. Two independent battery charging are available to ensure continuous fork-lift operations. The warehouse can accommodate around 55000 MTs of polymer grades packed in 25-kg PP woven sack bags.

Various consumables are made available on site in sufficient quantity to support continuous bagging and efficient evacuation of bagging silos. Transport contracts are ensured at all times for dispatch of product to each of the 327 districts in India.

Since the terminal handles a large number of grades destined for thousands of plastics processors, a robust display and tracking system assisted by RFID tags ensures that the right grade reaches the right customer.

Future Prospects

Over the next 5 to 7 years, PRPC will witness the largest petrochemical projects of national interest like expansion of Panipat Refinery's capacity from 15 MMTPA to 25 MMTPA, setting up of additional capacity of 450 KTA of Polypropylene Plant, etc. Further, IndianOil has also signalled for setting up of various plants at PRPC like 60 KTA Poly Butadiene Rubber (PBR), India's first Styrene Monomer project with a capacity of 387 TMTA, India's first mega-scale Maleic Anhydride Plant to manufacture value-added chemical products with a capacity of 120 KTA, etc. Moreover, prestigious projects like 3G ethanol plant is to be commissioned sometimes in January, 2023 and PX-PTA capacity expansion which are also planned to commission sometimes in the early FY 2023-24.

IndianOil embarks on Intensified TB Elimination Project in Uttar Pradesh and Chhattisgarh

IndianOil entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Central TB Division (CTD) under the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoH&FW), and the states of Uttar Pradesh and Chhattisgarh to undertake intensified TB elimination project. The agreement was inked in the presence of Mr. Hardeep Singh Puri, Union Minister of Petroleum & Natural Gas and Housing & Urban Affairs, and Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya, Union Minister of Health and Family Welfare. On behalf of IndianOil, Mr. Ranjan Kumar Mohapatra, Director (HR), signed the MoU with Mr. Vishal Chauhan, Joint Secretary (Policy), MoH&FW; Dr. Dharmendra Gahwai, State TB Officer, Chhattisgarh; and Dr. Shailendra Bhatnagar, State TB Officer, Uttar Pradesh. Mr. Pankaj Jain, Secretary, MoP&NG; Mr. Rajesh Bhushan, Secretary, MoH&FW; senior executives from IndianOil, CTD, and Ministries were also present on the occasion.

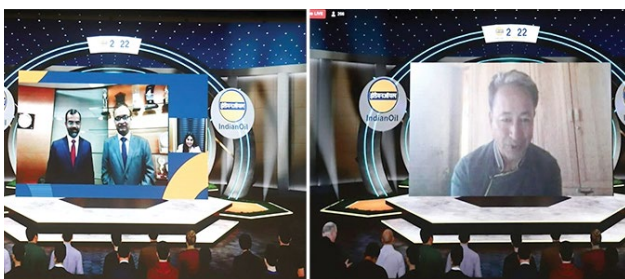
sustainable and eco-friendly innovations in the digital era, with live examples of his work in Ladakh.

The new machines are expected to give a 9.8% increase in overall production due to cycle time reduction.

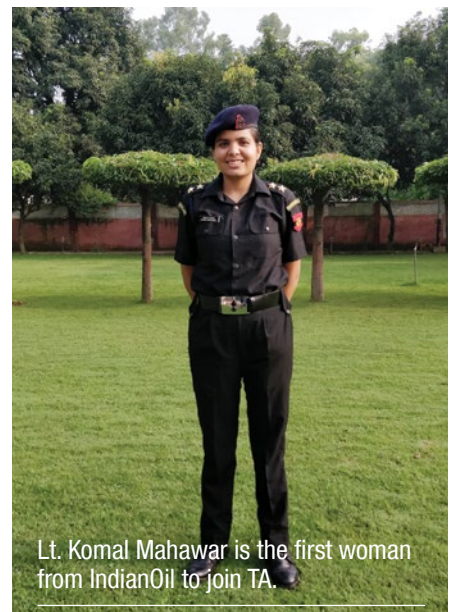

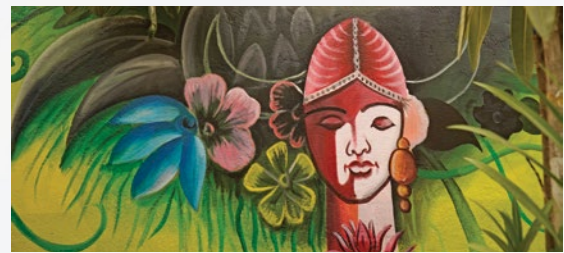

What Money Can't Buy: The Moral Limits of Markets

Is it acceptable to have a separate queue for a pricey ticket at our temples and hospitals? Should municipal governments sell advertising rights to businesses in all public places, clogging the landscape with gibberish that ordinary citizens must tolerate? What about promising our children expensive iPhones for good grades? Prof. Michael Sandel, who teaches political philosophy at Harvard, asks pertinent questions about the appropriateness of markets infringing on moral space in this beautifully scripted *New York Times* bestseller.

The economists who believe in utilitarianism (actions that maximise happiness for the greatest number of people) have argued that allowing market forces to determine human behaviour is the most efficient way for a society to function. As a result, they argue, some people value luxurious cars and are willing to pay a premium for them, whereas others may believe that money can be spent more wisely elsewhere. Whatever the case may be, the market efficiently completes a transaction based on perceived value.

Despite this usefulness, markets may be violating moral norms when the same economic principles are applied to organ trade or paid surrogacy. Though selling a kidney benefits the poor donor financially, the transaction is morally repugnant because of its exploitative nature.

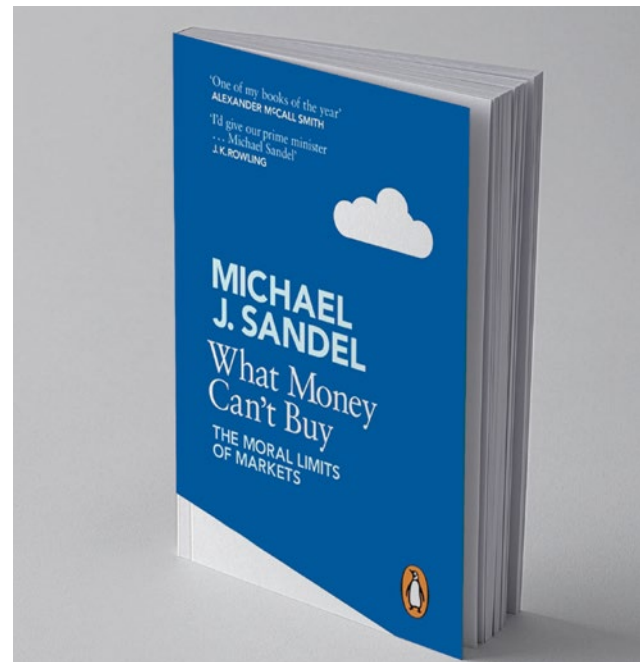
Similarly, consider a system in which there is a separate queue at our retail outlets for those willing to pay more. A system that violates the democratic principle of 'waiting for your turn', according to Sandel, is inherently immoral. Commercialisation of certain social exchanges crowds out moral principles.

Deliberating the several moral repugnancies of marketisation, Sandel highlights two important moral laws. The first one is referred to as the 'fairness objection'. If the transaction occurs under conditions of inequity or survival pressure (for example, the poor selling land to the land mafia), it violates moral boundaries. The

'corruption objection' denotes the second moral boundary. When some social processes are commercialised, society suffers morally. Rich nations getting away with pollution by contributing to restoration efforts elsewhere (such as in Africa), for example, is morally corrupting, according to Sandel. The moral credit those rich nations feel entitled to for paying for polluting undermines the environmental protection efforts in their own countries.

Sandel concludes the book with poignant questions: Do we want a society in which everything is for sale? Isn't it time we set moral boundaries for markets? ●

Brahmatal

A Marvel of Nature

A group of IOCIans — Suraj D. Randhumale, Manager (IA), WRO; Satyanarayan Patidar, Manager (IS), MPSO; Pratap Singh, Manager (F), MPSO; Ketan Bhartiya, Manager (F), Kandla FSSH; and Aditya V Kasera, Manager (F), MPSO — decided to go on a trek to Brahmatal in Uttarakhand in search of adventure and also to escape the monotony of routine work. The trek, a test of physical and mental endurance, ended up giving them a new perspective on life

Brahmatal, located at around 12,000 ft up in the Himalayas, is famous amongst trekkers, as it offers an adventurous blend of challenging trails and scintillating beauty. The trail remains covered in snow, for a good part of the year, and provides picturesque views of the surrounding landscapes. Upon completing the trek, you come across the frozen Brahmatal Lake and Brahmatal Peak, both of which are marvels of nature.

Planning and preparation

Brahmatal trek takes you through untouched forests, serene lakes, and lush meadows, all the way to the top of the mountain. Preparing well in terms of fitness and carrying essential equipment is advised.

We started our journey to Rishikesh, from where we would be heading to the base camp at Lohajung, a small village Garhwal Himalayas. On the way, we also took a dip in Har Ki Pauri in the holy Ganges river. The cold wind flowing down the Himalayas gave warnings about the kind climate we should be expecting during the trek.

Day 1: The road to Lohajung

During the 260-km journey to Lohajung we witnessed the immensity of the Himalayan ranges and caught glimpses of the beautiful ancient rivers Alaknanda, Bhagirathi, Mandakini, and Pindar at confluences in Devprayag, Rudraprayag, and Karnprayag. We reached Lohajung by evening where our guides briefed us about the trek.

The 4-km trek from Gujrani to Tilandi included a steep, ascending trail. We got to spend some time at Bekaltal Lake on the way. The lake remains frozen in January and February. From there, we headed towards our Tilandi camp site enjoying the mesmerising beauty of the surrounding mountains.

Day 4: Tilandi to Brahmatal Lake via Brahmatal Top

We started our 8-km trek to Brahmatal Lake via Brahmatal summit. On the way we stopped at Jhandi Top, where we found a temple of Lord Shiva with a big Trishul. The trail to Brahmatal is full of steep ascents and descents and requires a lot of team work to traverse. Finally, when we

reached Brahmatal Top at 12250 ft, we were welcomed by breathtaking views of the Himalayas. We enjoyed the beauty of Mount Trishul, the Nandaghunti and the other surrounding mountains of the Himalayas. We also hoisted an IndianOil banner and a Servo flag at Brahmatal top.
