Chidambaram Trophy for Rest XI

Hyderabad, Dec. 23: Rest of India won the Under-19 cricket tournament for Chidambaram Trophy by virtue of their first innings lead over Central Zone. On Saturday, the final day of the four-day match at Gymkhana Grounds, Rest set an impossible target -- 498 runs -- for Central, who after initial hiccup, ceded the day with 153 for four. Opener Asif played a great knock for the Central with a fine 76.

India set for big lead
KANPUR, Jan. 11 (UNI). An opening wicket partnership of 126 runs between Ajay Jadhav (72) and Mayur Kadrekar (85) helped India under-19 gain an 88-run lead with five first innings wickets standing on the second day today of the four-day Test match against Pakistan at the Green Park stadium.

Replying to Pakistan's first innings total of 164, the home team scored 232 for five. At draw of stumps, Bhupendra Singh (43) and Anil Khumbale (35) were at the crease.

Overnight batsman Ajay Jadhav along with his opening partner Mayur Kadrekar, who was included in place of Dhruv Pandey in the Kanpur Test, kept the scoreboard moving slowly using an impressive 72 with the help of eleven boundaries.

Kadrekar played a chancy innings on his debut. The only boundary India made in the morning session was when Jadhav offered a sharp catch to Zahir Fazal.

Rest lift trophy
HYDERABAD, Dec. 23: Rest of India lifted the M.A. Chidambaram under 19 Trophy defeating Central Zone on first innings lead, after their four day encounter ended in a tense draw at the Gymkhana Grounds on Saturday.

Set to score an almost impossible total of 498, the Central Zone team suffered a few anxious moments before saving the match and ended up 153 for four including 20 penalty runs.

Rest of India's first innings score of 323 for no loss, Central Zone prolonged their innings to score 344 for five before calling a halt. Top scorer Mayur Kadrekar put up a stirring 99 in the first innings but it was not enough to help his side.
